

Eleanor Roosevelt

Overview

Anna Eleanor Roosevelt (1884-1962), wife of the thirty-second president of the United States, was a philanthropist, author, world diplomat, and resolute champion of liberal causes. Decades after her death, she remained a role model and a much-respected figure in America's recent history.

Eleanor Roosevelt was born in New York City on October 10, 1884, into an economically comfortable but troubled family. Her father was Elliott Roosevelt, the younger brother of Theodore Roosevelt, a future president of the United States. Although handsome and charming, Eliot was plagued by frequent mental depressions and by alcoholism. Her mother, Sara, beautiful but insecure, was preoccupied with the family's image in upper-class society and embarrassed by her daughter's homeliness. Roosevelt's father owned a summer home for alcoholics.


