Borrowing from other libraries

Choose from Interlibrary Loan (ILL) or TexShare.

Remote Access to electronic resources:

Students log in using their myLC username and password. Faculty and staff use their computer account username and password.

LibGuide Request

You can request a librarian to create a LibGuide for a subject or for your course in specific. A LibGuide is an online collection or resources providing research help and information on specific topic or course.

Online Tutorial Request

You can request the librarian to create a online video covering an aspect of library instruction or other subject to be posted on the library web page or BlackBoard course.

Suggest Library Purchases

Tell us what books and other media will support your courses. Provide your "recommended reading lists" *before your students ask us* for the items on them. Help us support your courses by filling out the Material purchase request form

Textbook Request
